AVRSB Long-Range Outlook: Opportunity to Respond by May 15

AVRSB has developed a **Long-Range Outlook**, a 10-year planning document that examines all schools in our region. It takes into account enrolment and demographic trends, programming, building use, and capacity and maintenance of all schools in AVRSB. Long Range Outlooks are a new provincial requirement for school boards, and will be updated annually to reflect current and developing circumstances in schools.

Why is AVRSB creating a Long-Range Outlook?

AVRSB has engaged in long-range planning processes for different areas of our region over the last number of years. This has helped us gather public input and set a strategic course for the Board's decision-making and actions.

With the introduction of a revised provincial School Review Policy in October 2014, all Nova Scotia school boards must now create Long-Range Outlook documents and update them annually to reflect current and developing circumstances in schools. Every five years the Long-Range Outlook will be refreshed.

AVRSB *Volunteers in School* Policy

The AVRSB has had a *Volunteers in Schools* Policy since 1999. As demonstrated in this policy, the Board takes its obligations seriously to create safe environments for learning by taking all reasonable steps to minimize risks and threats to students. Because student safety is a top priority, this policy has undergone an extensive review to ensure that any potential gaps in practice are closed or minimized. All recommendations for change are being presented to our school community members. The proposed AVRSB *Volunteers in Schools* policy is being circulated to our school stakeholders for the opportunity to respond to the proposed changes and to provide further input. To highlight some of the changes:

- clearly defines volunteers versus visitors;
- requires volunteers to complete a standard application form for any volunteering;
- will continue to require the completion of Criminal Records Check and Child Abuse Registry checks prior to working with students but will now require re-checks be completed every (3) three years; and,
- includes reference to procedures for monitoring volunteers in schools.

The recommended changes to the *Volunteers in Schools* policy are not to discourage volunteering in the AVRSB. It is to employ the best practices to ensure our policy is effective as possible for decreasing the chances of student harm from volunteers.
